95th Thomas P. Hinman Dental Meeting Draws More Than 23,000 Dental Professionals to Atlanta

It's been 95 years since Dr. Thomas P. Hinman organized the first dental clinic "strictly for seriousminded educational purposes." He invited 120 dentists to Atlanta to hear three speakers impart their dental knowledge. Today, attendance is not limited and this year's meeting attracted approximately 23,150 dentists, dental hygienists, dental assistants, dental students and other dental professionals and industry personnel to the

Georgia World Congress Center in Atlanta. The meeting offered 170 courses and workshops given by 65 leading dental experts.

As one of the largest dental meetings in the country, Hinman also featured 425 exhibiting companies, demon-

strating the latest in dental technology, products, equipment and services. This is a far cry from 1942 when Hinman introduced technical exhibits to the meeting and featured just 14 exhibitors.

This year's continuing education program offered 53 participation courses from some of dentistry's most notable experts, including Dr. Gordon Christensen, Dr. Samuel Low, Dr. Linda Niessen, Dr. Henry Gremillion, Dr. Karl Koerner, Dr. Charles Wakefield, Dr. Nader Sharifi and more.

Hinman introduced a new computerized accreditation process at the 2007 meeting. Attendees used the onsite CE printing stations to enter their information and print their own

CE certificates. Others used their laptops and the free wireless Internet at the meeting to upload their CE information.

With more emphasis this year on attracting dental students - especially those who attend southeastern dental schools - Hinman offered a student orientation on Friday during the meeting. Hinman's Past General Chairman Dr. Bruce Ashendorf outlined courses the students

may find of interest, offered suggestions on maximizing time spent at the meeting, and gave pointers on maneuvering the exhibit hall and surrounding areas. Dental student attendance was estimated at more than 800.

"All in all, I believe the 95th Hinman Dental

Meeting delivered on its promise to be one of the best meetings ever, providing highly desirable and heavily attended courses and workshops, more technical exhibits than ever before, a new CE accreditation process and an enhanced and expanded auxiliary program," said Dr. Richard Goodroe, General Chairman of the 2007 Hinman Dental Meeting. "Again, Hinman leads the way in continuing education and proves to be where dental professionals want to be."




My last thank you must go to our Hinman staff. They are the glue that really binds the Hinman family together. A highlight of the year has been getting to know and work with all of the staff.


The wireless Internet access in building A was up and running. We received 300 hits on Thursday on the CE certification system through our Web site, so we know that it was being utilized.




