

HINMAN 2013 BEGINS NEXT CENTURY WITH NEARLY 22,000 IN ATTENDANCE



As it embarked on another century of continuing education excellence, the 101st Thomas P. Hinman Dental Meeting attracted 21,872 dentists, hygienists, assistants, students and other dental professionals and industry personnel to the Georgia World Congress Center in Atlanta. The 2013 meeting featured more than 65 world-class dental experts; 220 courses, including more than 60 hands-on workshops; all-day educational tracks for dentists, hygienists, assistants and office staff; and 430 companies demonstrating the latest in dentistry.

"It was an outstanding meeting this year with strong attendance, a stellar educational program, an exhibit hall filled to capacity and Hinman's signature social events that continue to excite and entertain our guests," said Dr. Brad Greenway, General Chairman of the 2013 Hinman Dental Meeting. "We had more participation courses than ever before and many new speakers and topics for Hinman attendees to enjoy."

This year, Hinman sold out its exhibit hall and featured a Classic Car Exhibit with beautifully restored cars owned by Hinman members. In addition, the hall hosted a Hinman Treasure Quest and a daily vintage jewelry giveaway. Also, 1950's-inspired Hinman characters could be found on the show floor offering a chance to win prepaid gas

cards. The hall included Messages to Our Military where attendees completed nearly 2,500 postcards to be sent to servicemen and women overseas.

Dental student attendance has never been higher than the 2013 meeting. The meeting attracted 22 percent more dental

students this year with a total of 1,086 students from schools across the country. Many took part in the Dental Student Networking Reception and panel discussion

held on Friday afternoon, as well as the two special event parties, the Dentist Reception and Auxiliary Reception, held later that night.

Hinman attracted a total of 6,020 dentists, 4,468 dental hygienists and 2,890 dental assistants. Some of the most popular courses included Karen Davis' "Think



Outside Mouth: Treatment Planning for Non-Surgical Periodontal Treatment," which drew 1,657 attendees, and Dr.

John Svirsky's "Oral Cancer 2013: Lumps, Bumps & Lesions for All Seasons," which attracted 1,411 people. Of the paid courses, "Business Office Bonanza," drew the most participants with 523 in attendance.

"Many will agree that it was the best Hinman ever," added Dr. Greenway. "From the first night with Jack Hanna to the meeting's closing event, the three days were filled with tremendous laughter, learning and memorable moments to last us until next year."



Dr. Tom Moorman's Adventures in Pecan Farming

County, Georgia. Her family farmed for a living and my father grew up on a farm and was a veterinarian. As soon as I was big enough to draw water from a dug well with a rope and bucket, I became his after-hours and weekend veterinarian assistant, spending many hours treating farm animals with him. I grew to really admire the beauty of the large pecan trees that I saw around many of the farm

houses we visited.

orchard on land that we purchased in Rockdale County. The Stuart pecan trees we planted took 30 years to become productive. I thought that by the time I retired from dentistry that the money would grow on trees and just fall to the ground, but boy, was I wrong. There were several obstacles I had to overcome before finally having a successful crop, including deer, leaf fungus and the hard

Today, Dr. Butler is an active member Dr. Butler's interest in railroading was developed through his great grandfather, Thomas Dowling, who purchased the Live Oak, Perry & Gulf railroad to carry logs from Hudson (on the Suwannee river) to his saw mill in Live Oak, FL in 1905. Thomas and his nephew, RL Dowling teamed up together with dreams of building a railroad on a westward path with hopes of reaching the Gulf coast someday. Once they started expanding their railroad lines, they also built a large saw mill, which became Dowling Park, FL and a waterworks in Live Oak, FL.

Their railroad eventually extended for 64 miles to Loughridge, FL, with 1917 being the most active year for the of the National Model Railroad Association, an association that is devoted to the development, promotion and enjoyment of the hobby of model railroading. He has been working on model replicas of some of the historic buildings from the LOP&G railroad line. He has already completed a turpentine still and plans to build other structures you can't find these days, so the kids of today get a glimpse of yesterday. We finally had a small pecan crop in 2008. We picked the nuts up by hand with the help of some others. Our first large crop was in 2011, which we picked up using the help of a tree shaker and large tarp. In 2012, to help our efforts, I bought an air blast sprayer, harvester, and pecan cleaner. I also put an irrigation system in the orchard.

I have finally found a use for all the botany that I took as an undergraduate at Emory University. You have to learn a lot about plant physiology, plant pathology, horticulture and entomology to produce pecans. I wish that the government was as helpful to dentistry as it is to pecan farming. There are several helpful local resources I turn to, including the University of Georgia's pecan research center in Tifton, Georgia and the USDA SE Research Lab in Byron, GA.

You may like to know that pecans are a health food. Ninety percent of the fatty oils in pecans are heart-healthy. Pecans lower the blood cholesterol levels, contain 19 essential vitamins and minerals, and are an especially good source of antioxidants. So do not feel guilty when you eat your next piece of pecan

Riding in my John Deere tractor can really relieve the stress I get from practicing dentistry. My grandsons Bo and Thomas Caves always look forward to helping Granddaddy Tom on the farm. My patients usually don't recognize me when they see me in my overalls or they just say, "I see you are not working today." I want to tell them one of my favorite quotes from Thomas Edison: "Most people don't recognize opportunity when it comes, because it's usually dressed in overalls and looks like work."


