

### HINMAN 2016 DRAWS NEARLY 20,000 ATTENDEES & HOSTS FIRST "DANCING IN THE DOME" PARTY

The 104th Thomas P. Hinman Dental Meeting provided "Your Total Health Connection" March 17-19, 2016 when the meeting attracted nearly 20,000 dentists, hygienists, assistants, students, other dental



professionals and industry personnel to the Georgia World Congress Center in Atlanta. The 104th Hinman featured more than 75 speakers, including 27 who were new to Hinman; nearly 250 courses with Mini-Residencies in pediatrics, geriatrics and cone beam anatomy; the returning G.O.L.D. (Graduates of the Last Decade) Program; a new S.I.L.V.E.R. Program for dentists approaching retirement; the new Total Health Pavilion in the exhibit hall; and nearly 400 companies demonstrating the latest products and services in dentistry. Dr. Jim Roos, General Chairman; Dr. Jonathan Dubin, President; Dr. Brad Greenway, Program Chairman; and Dr. Kate Robinson, Program Chairman, assembled an outstanding program and

> memorable Hinman 2016 meeting. "We were especially proud of the Mini-Residencies; the G.O.L.D. Program, which attracted nearly 350 graduates of the last decade; the new Total Health Connection Pavilion; and an incredible party in the Georgia Dome with over 2,500 tickets sold," said General Chairman Roos.

Hinman filled its exhibit hall, which hosted not only 400 companies, but also several Total Health Connection

courses, Table Clinics, the Hinman Treasure Quest and daily prize giveaways. The Keynote Session was also filled to capacity with 1,700 in attendance and featured Captain Richard Phillips, who captivated the audience with the harrowing

story of having his ship captured by Somali pirates in 2009.

Hinman 2016 attracted a total of 5,588 dentists, 4,207 dental hygienists and 2,647 dental assistants. Some of the most popular courses

included Dr. Ann Spolarich's "Risks and Benefits of Dietary Supplements," drawing 1,362 attendees and Dr. John Svirsky's "Bugs That Will Eat You," which attracted

1,107 people. Also popular were Dr. James Wood's "Forensic Case Files – Not Exactly What You See on CSI," that drew 1,013 in attendance; the Dental and Hygiene New Product Forum, attracting 821 attendees; and Ms. Debra Engelhardt-Nash's "The New Patient Experience: From Phone Call to Recall," filling the room with 800 attendees.

Dental student attendance also was impressive with a total of 764 students from schools across the country. This was an 8% increase over last year. Many students took part in the G.O.L.D. Program and Dental Student Networking Luncheon and Panel Discussion. At the Scholars' Luncheon held during the meeting, Hinman awarded 89 students at 36 different schools with scholarships. Over the past 16 years, the Hinman Dental Society has contributed nearly \$8 million in scholarships and large gifts in support of dental education.
