Hinman 2022 Attracts More Than 12,000 Attendees & Exhibitors

Holding its first fully in-person meeting since 2019. the 109th Thomas P. Hinman Dental Meeting, held March 17-19, recorded an attendance of 12,215 dentists, hygienists, assistants, students and other dental professionals and industry personnel. With the theme, "Navigating Dental Disruptions," Hinman 2022 filled the Georgia World Congress Center and Omni Hotel in Atlanta.

Hinman 2022 featured 245 educational lectures and workshops presented by more than 60 experts in the dental profession, as well as a special Women Dentist Program (pictured above) and new educational tracks for new dentists, hygienists, assistants and dental business office staff. The Exhibit Hall hosted nearly 300 exhibiting companies, showcasing new technology, equipment, products and services for the entire practice. It also featured the Learning Lab Pavilion, Total Health Pavilion, Table Clinics and the Podcast Lounge.





Dr. Kate Robinson, General Chair for Hinman, along with her program chairs, Drs. Jim Roos and Randy Phillips, assembled an outstanding educational program and social events for the Hinman 2022 Meeting. Hinman's Night Out at the Tabernacle on Friday night attracted more than 1,200 dental professionals and quests. In addition, the Keynote Session was one of the best attended with more than 1,500 people turning out to hear popular comedian Kathleen Madigan, a veteran of the Tonight Show, Letterman and "Comedians in Cars Getting Coffee."

"We were thrilled to see more than 12,000 people, gathering together again to share valuable human connections and take advantage of everything from exciting new speakers to numerous hands-on courses and fun-filled social and networking events," said Dr. Robinson. "Following two years of upheaval and adversity, it was wonderful to reconnect with everyone and come together to share best practices and learn from one another."

Hinman 2022 drew a total of 4,112 dentists, 2,812 dental hygienists, 1,402 dental assistants, 877 office staff and 1,741 exhibitors. Some of the most popular (Continues on page 8)



Hinman Honors Retired Executive Director Sylvia Ratchford with Distinguished Service Award

At the Hinman 2022 Keynote Session on March 17, retired Executive Director, Sylvia Ratchford, was honored with the Distinguished Service Award. The Distinguished Service Award is the highest honor the meeting can bestow upon an individual. Its recipient is selected for having achieved national renown for service to his/her chosen profession. Drs. Kate Robinson and William Rousseau presented her with the award for successfully leading the Hinman Dental Meeting and Hinman Dental Society for 25 years. This is the first time Hinman has presented the Distinguished Service Award since 2006.



Sylvia worked in the hospitality industry since her graduation from the University of Georgia in 1976. After several years of work in sales for the Peachtree Plaza, the Inforum and AmericasMart, she accepted the position of Executive Director of the Hinman Dental Society in 1996. During her career, she served on the board of the Atlanta Convention and Visitors Bureau and as President of the Southeastern Chapter of the Professional Convention Management Association.

Under her leadership and during her tenure, Sylvia helped grow the Hinman Dental Meeting to its peak of more than 23,000 attendees and 430+ exhibiting companies, establishing Hinman as one of the nation's leading continuing education dental meetings. She helped elevate Hinman to be consistently one of Atlanta's top 10



courses included: Ms. Marianne Dryer's "The AAP Classification of Periodontal and Peri-Implant Diseases: Aligning the Dental Hygiene Diagnosis" drawing 917 attendees, and Dr. Anthony Cardoza's "Dispelling the 'CSI Effect' Myth: An Overview of Contemporary Forensic Dentistry," which attracted 646 people. Also popular were Dr. Neil Warshawsky's "Learn to Identify the Top Five Reasons to Refer Your Kids for Orthodontic Intervention," that drew 628 in attendance; Dr. Harold Crossley's "Marijuana's Coming to Town: Will You Be Ready?," attracting 591 attendees; and Dr. Alan Budenz's "Numb, Number, Numbest: Updates on Local Anesthesia," filling the room with 531 attendees. In addition, the all-day educational tracks had strong attendance with

the Prevention Convention drawing 381 attendees, Assisting Essentials attracting 229 and Business Office Bonanza welcoming 180 attendees.

Dental student and resident attendance was strong with 353 students from dental schools across the country attending Hinman 2022. In addition, there were 168 pre-dental students, 201 hygiene students and 265 assisting students who attended Hinman this year to take advantage of various programs. This year, 96 students attended the Pre-Dental Society program held on Saturday, March 19. Since August 2021, the Hinman Dental Society has awarded more than \$175,000 in scholarships to the Dental College of Georgia and other dental, hygiene and assisting programs throughout the Southeast. Over the past

21 years, the Hinman Dental Society has contributed more than \$10 million in scholarships and large gifts in support of dental education.

In addition to the onsite program, Hinman also offered five virtual courses to registered attendees free of charge. The courses, which began in December and were provided by Dr. Lee Silverstein, Dr. Ken Berley, Mr. Charles Loretto, Ms. Carol Paige and Hinman exhibitors, have drawn more than 6,140 participants thus far. The virtual courses will be available through May 31.

Planning has already begun for Hinman 2023, which will be held March 16 - 18.




