



Hinman's First Hybrid Meeting Attracts 7,026 Attendees

On March 12th and 13th, Hinman hosted its first hybrid Meeting, which attracted nearly 7,000 dentists, hygienists, assistants, students and other dental professionals and industry personnel. More than 2,000 attended the Meeting in person at the Omni Hotel. The remaining 5,000 attended virtually, participating in courses and events that were both livestreamed and recorded for on-demand access. The theme, “Feel at Home with Hinman,” emphasized the goal to make everyone feel comfortable, whether they attended in person or virtually.

“We couldn’t be happier with the results of our very first hybrid meeting. I believe Hinman created the perfect balance of a safe, in-person educational meeting and a virtual learning environment that was rich in content and promoted active engagement,” said Dr. Robert J. O’Donnell, General Chair of Hinman 2021. “We surveyed our previous attendees and realized that we must offer something for everyone during these challenging times. We have a responsibility to our patients to stay abreast of the latest developments in the dental profession.”

Hinman 2021’s educational program offered more than 45 in-person courses and more than 40 virtual courses, including live Q&A with the speakers. There were 48 world-class speakers featured and 10 in-person participation courses, as well as Hinman’s very first live virtual participation course

led by Dr. David Clark. The meeting drew a total of 2,604 dentists, 2,339 hygienists, 423 assistants and 234 office staff. Hinman 2021 also attracted both in-person and virtual exhibitors (473), dental and pre-dental students (143), educators (32), laboratory technicians (24) and other dental guests (54). According to Hinman’s survey, 39% of those who participated were first-time Hinman attendees.

In addition to the courses offered, the Keynote Session was livestreamed and featured Air Force Colonel (Ret.) Nicole Malachowski, the first female Thunderbird pilot and one of the first women to fly modern fighters in combat. More than 800 attendees either viewed it in person or online. The onsite exhibit hall, which hosted 70 industry companies, was also a big draw. It offered eight two-hour timeslots for attendees to choose from on Friday and Saturday and limited attendance to 225 people per two-hour slot to ensure social distancing. Online exhibitors, such as Crest+Oral B, Atlanta Dental Supply, Philips Sonicare, 3M and more, also had traffic with 2,669 total digital visitors.

The in-person courses limited attendance to a maximum of 148 people. Some of the most popular courses included:

- Dr. Harold Crossley’s “Opioid Use, Misuse, Abuse and Addiction: Appropriate Opioid and Non-Opioid Prescribing”

out from the meeting last March, we were very excited as we watched the number of registered attendees grow each day. We had a stellar lineup with only the very best speakers from all over the country. We carefully watched the progress of the pandemic, educating ourselves as much as possible, and seeking guidance from healthcare experts outside of Hinman, in order to understand how the pandemic might affect our meeting. Safety first was our priority, and, with just one week left before our meeting was to begin, we cancelled. We were confident then and now that this was the right call – no question.

A new breed of the Hinman Dental Meeting, unlike any other before, began to evolve immediately. Our talented Hinman staff immersed themselves in the new language of Zoom meetings, virtual platforms, and the possibilities of hosting a new and unique "hybrid" model, where registered guests could actually choose the type of course they were most comfortable with – in-person, virtual, or a combination of both. Appropriately, we modified our theme to "Feel at Home With Hinman" and, once again, we presented the "Best Hinman Ever", merely one year later, despite all the odds against us. We often commented that this process was not only like learning a new language; it was like learning a new language with a different alphabet! No easy task, for sure.

Drs. Jane Puskas and William Rousseau, always at the ready, helped every step of the way to re-program our original 2020 meeting. Together, we carefully reduced the number of speakers and courses so the program would more easily fit into our new hybrid format. Along those lines, I applaud the Hinman staff for their unconditional commitment to embrace the new 2021 meeting. By now, we are all familiar with Zoom

networking community, "Networking Powered by Grip," allowed event participants to connect and schedule meetings. The all-new "Hinman Studio" broadcasted live from Atlanta and featured interviews with industry experts and influencers.

Planning has already begun for Hinman 2022, which will be held March 17-19 at the Georgia World Congress Center and Omni Hotel at CNN Center in Atlanta. In the post-meeting attendee survey, Hinman discovered that 90% would like to

meetings; however, the platform that hosted the virtual courses is extremely more complicated in that it needed to support thousands of viewers, both live and online, without freezing or running out of band width. The learning curve was steep, but each member of the staff became experts in a very short period of time. Thank you all! Your dedication and loyalty are appreciated.

It was terrific to see the halls and classrooms of the Omni Hotel filled with familiar faces! We saw the genuine smiles behind the masks and we gave fist bumps from our socially distanced settings. Most all of the in-person classes were sold out to the reduced capacity of the rooms. Speakers were delighted to be back presenting to a live audience. Exhibitors could actually be in front of potential clients again to make a sale. All good things.

We all know that Hinman is about so much more than just continuing education. We like to see each other and share stories. We want to catch up with our classmates and colleagues after hours. We simply enjoy being together for a common purpose. Last year, we were the first major dental meeting to cancel because of the pandemic; this year we were the first to come back with in-person learning. Congratulations to everyone who helped us with this accomplishment!

It was a long and difficult twelve-month journey, but *We Did It!* Our all-volunteer organization stepped up to the challenge and delivered another Best Hinman Ever. Thank you for doing what you do best—being gracious, polite, professional, and attentive to detail. I am overwhelmed with gratitude to be a member of the Hinman Dental Society, especially during this most difficult last year. It has been the honor of my career to serve as General Chair of Hinman 2020 and Hinman 2021.

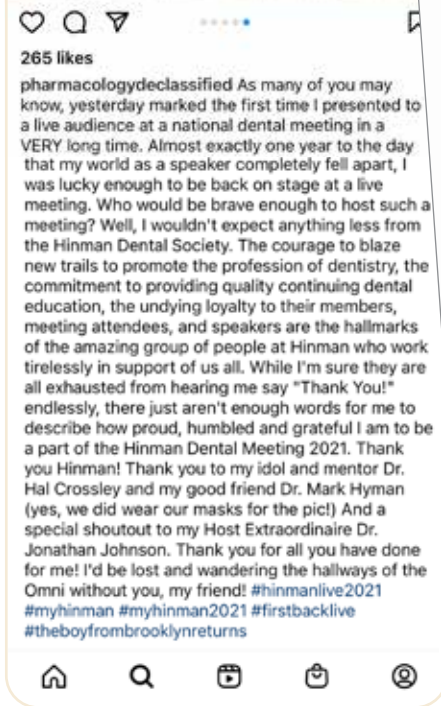

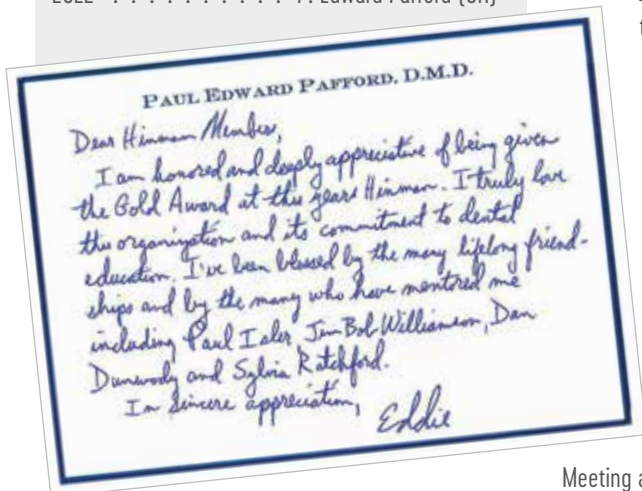

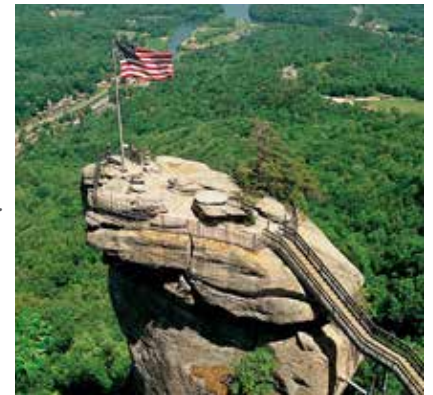
