University of Tennessee School of Dentistry Hosts 15th Annual Hinman Student Research Symposium

The fifteenth Hinman Student Research Symposium was held Oct. 30 through Nov. 1, 2009, at the historic Peabody Hotel in Memphis, Tenn. The Symposium featured oral and poster presentations of research projects by dental students and graduate students from dental schools across the nation. At this year's Symposium, 83 students represented 49 dental schools in

29 states, the District of Columbia, and four Canadian provinces. Thirteen dental students from the University of Tennessee presented their projects and acted as hosts for the Symposium.

The Symposium was sponsored by the University of Tennessee College of Dentistry and co-sponsored by the Hinman Dental Society, which holds one of the nation's largest continuing dental education meetings each March in Atlanta. The Symposium was also supported in part by grants from the National Institute

MCG School of Dentistry Groundbreaking

The state's only dental school, located in Augusta, broke ground for its new facility on Wednesday, Sept. 30 at 3:30 p.m. Guest speakers at the Medical College of Georgia (MCG) School of Dentistry ceremony included Gov. Sonny Perdue, University System of Georgia Chancellor Erroll B. Davis Jr. and Augusta Mayor Deke Copenhaver.

"Construction of the new School of Dentistry facility is one of MCG's top priorities," MCG President Daniel W. Rahn said. "The state needs more dentists, and this facility will allow us to expand our educational capacity to better keep pace with state need."

The five-story facility will occupy a portion of the site of the former Gilbert Manor housing project. Demolition of the Gilbert Manor property is complete and construction has begun and will last approximately two years. The building should be occupied by early 2012.

"Oral health is essential to overall health," School of Dentistry Dean Connie L. Drisko said. "The new building will help us fulfill our mission to improve oral and craniofacial health through scientific discovery, patient care and educating future oral health care providers. We need a facility that reflects the quality of our faculty, staff and students."

The \$112 million, 268,788-square-foot building will be more than 100,000 square feet larger than the existing building, which opened in 1970 on Laney Walker Boulevard. The expanded space will allow the school to increase its class size incrementally from 63 to 100 by 2016, and its residency positions from 44 to 72. The increase will make the MCG School of Dentistry among the largest in the nation; only 13 of the country's 58 dental

schools have a class size of 100 or more, according to the American Dental Association.

The growth should help alleviate the shortage of dentists in the state, which has 41.4 dentists per 100,000 citizens — considerably fewer than the nationwide ratio of 54.3 per 100,000, according to the American Dental Association. Approximately 80-85 percent of MCG School of Dentistry graduates practice in Georgia.

"One aspect of the Board of Regents' strategic plan is to enable the university system to produce more graduates of health professions programs to meet statewide needs," Chancellor Davis said. "As the state's only dental school, the MCG School of Dentistry is a crucial component in meeting the health care needs of Georgia's citizens. We are grateful to our funding partners for their help in bringing us one step closer to achieving that goal."

The facility will house the dental school's nine specialty clinics, two large student clinics, simulation labs, the School of Allied Health Sciences' dental hygiene program, an administration area, an expanded faculty practice and a new Center for Esthetic and Implant Dentistry. Patient visits are projected to increase significantly.

"In addition to being designed to accommodate current and future dental technologies, the building will be welcoming and comfortable for patients through the use of generous day lighting, wood paneling and brick," said John Starr, principal architect for Atlanta-

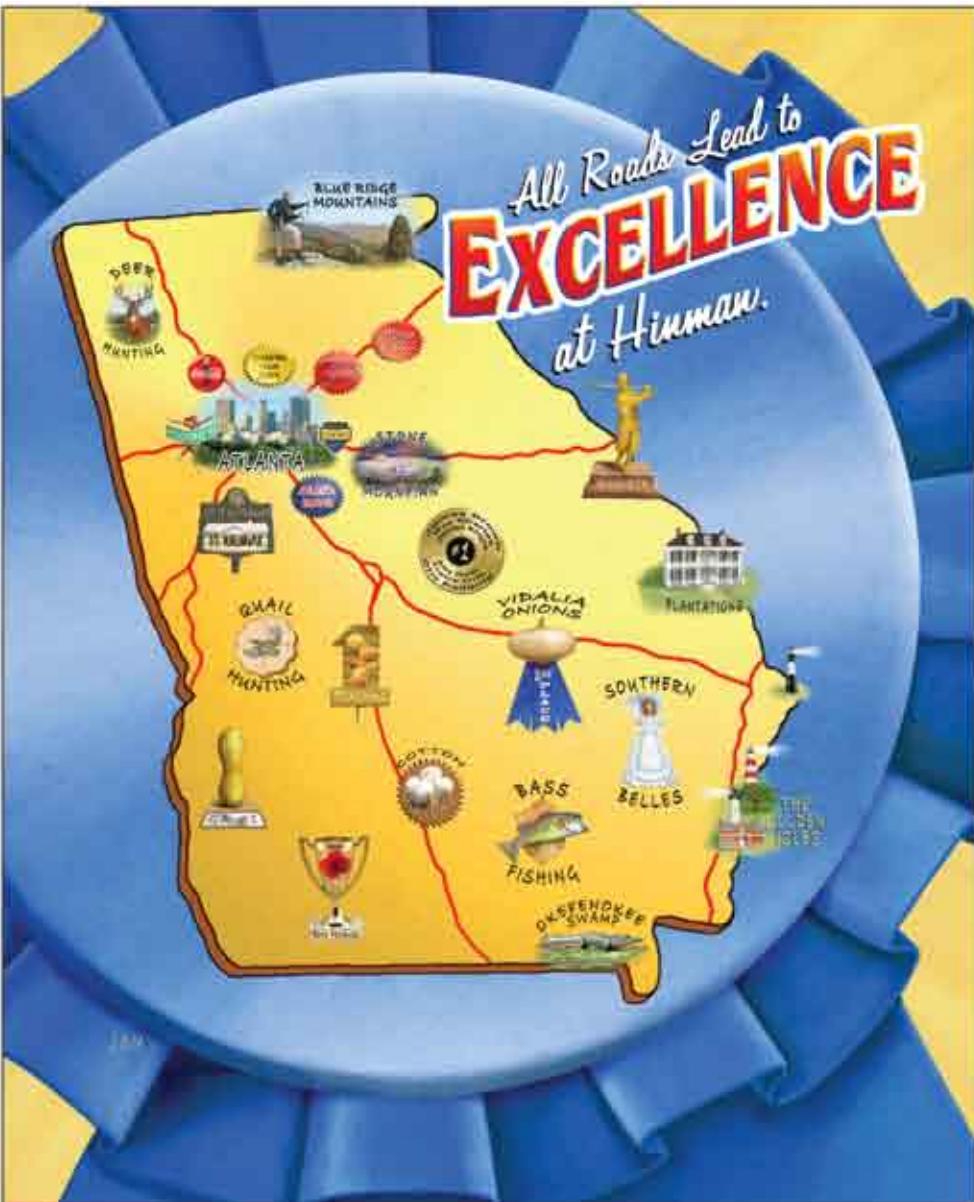


based architectural firm Lord, Aeck & Sargent, which designed the project in collaboration with Francis Cauffman Architects. The architects consulted with faculty, students and a Patient- and Family-Centered Care Advisory Group on key features of the project.

Financing for the facility's construction includes \$5 million appropriated by the state in the 2008 budget, \$97 million in bonds approved by the Georgia Legislature in the 2009 and 2010 budgets and nearly \$7.5 million in private gifts and pledges. The Augusta Commission provided \$10 million in 2008 for University System of Georgia acquisition of the Augusta Housing Authority's Gilbert Manor property for MCG expansion. MCG is continuing to seek additional private support for the project.

Planning also is under way for the Commons, a new building that will be adjacent to the new School of Dentistry. The Commons will include classrooms, computer rooms and conference rooms for dental and medical students. Other School of Medicine facilities also are proposed for the Gilbert Manor site. 🌿
